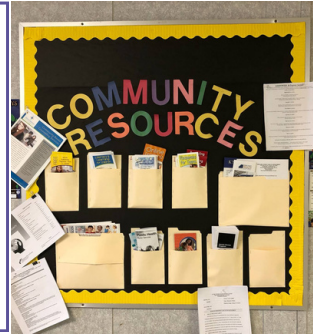


COMMUNITY RESOURCES

INFORMATION ABOUT COMMUNITY RESOURCES IS AVAILABLE TO THE PARENT OR FAMILY.

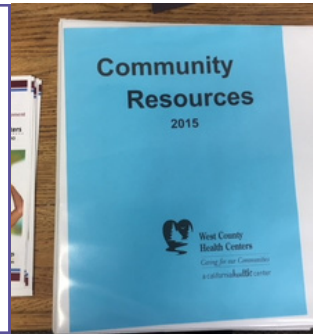
RESOURCE LIBRARY

A shelf or binder is available to parents that includes community resources.



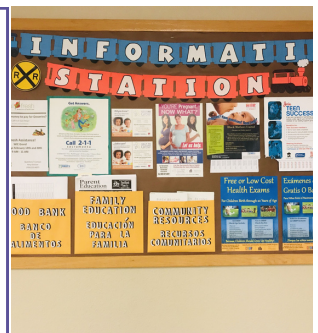
WEBSITE OR SOCIAL MEDIA PAGE

RURAL CAPITAL AREA COMMUNITY RESOURCES



Rural Capital Area Workforce Solutions

Administers programs designed to assist eligible participants in gaining and retaining employment. Provides funding for child care assistance, transportation, work-related expenses and more.

Has a database of community resources, including but not limited to: agencies that help pay for rent or utilities, parenting classes, help finding food or housing, child care, crisis counseling or substance abuse treatment, etc.



Early Childhood Intervention

For children age birth to 36 months with a developmental delay or disability, Early Childhood Intervention Services (ECI) may be able to help you and your child. Services are provided in the home and in other places where your child goes regularly, for example, a childcare center, park, library, or other community setting.



Women, Infants, and Children Program (WIC)

A supplemental nutrition program for pregnant women, mothers, and young children. Participants learn about nutrition and how to stay healthy and receive benefits to purchase healthy foods. Services are free to those who are eligible.
